**Regulations Respecting District Health Authority Parking Fees Exemptions
made by the Governor in Council
pursuant to subsection 84(2A) of Chapter 6 of the
Acts of 2000, the *Health Authorities Act***

Citation

1 These regulations may be cited as the *District Health Authority Parking Fees Exemption Regulations*.

Definitions

2 In these regulations,

- (a) "Act" means the *Health Authorities Act*;
- (b) "designated parking fees and costs" means the fees and costs designated in subsection 3(2);
- (c) "designated organization" means an organization designated in subsection 3(1).

Designations for the purpose of exemption under subsection 84(2A) of Act

- 3 (1) Every organization that receives Community Transportation Assistance Program funding from Service Nova Scotia and Municipal Relations is designated for the purpose of subsection 84(2A) of the Act.
- (2) Every fee or cost charged by a district health authority on a monthly, daily, or hourly basis for authorized parking of a motor vehicle on the district health authority's property is designated for the purpose of subsection 84(2A) of the Act.

Exemption from parking fees and costs

4 A designated organization is exempt from designated parking fees and costs.

 - (ba) "common area" means, for the purposes of clause 19(1)(a), that part of a multiple unit residential complex or condominium complex not comprising a residential unit or a residential condominium unit;
 - (b) repealing clause (g) and substituting the following clause:
 - (g) "electricity cost" means only a charge for the amount of electric current actually used, and does not include a charge for a service related to providing an electric current, including all of the following:
 - (i) a base charge, demand charge, capacity charge or similar fee or charge,
 - (ii) an after-hour charge,
 - (iii) a collection visit charge,
 - (iv) a connect charge,
 - (v) a seasonal disconnect fee,
 - (vi) a street light charge,
 - (vii) the Cowie Hill surtax,
 - (viii) a late payment charge;

- 2 Section 18 of the regulations and its heading are repealed and the following Section and heading substituted:

Point-of-sale rebate for residential electricity customer

- 18 (1)** On behalf of Her Majesty in right of the Province, an electricity supplier shall pay or credit a point-of-sale rebate to a residential electricity customer in an amount equal to the tax on that portion of a supply of electricity consumed on or after September 1, 2008, by the residential electricity customer in any period or portion of a period on or after September 1, 2008, that exceeds an amount calculated by multiplying the number of days in the period that are on or after September 1, 2008, by 27.4 kilowatt hours per day.
- (2)** A point-of-sale rebate to a residential electricity customer must be shown on the invoice or receipt issued to the customer in a manner that clearly indicates the amount of the rebate.

- 3 Subsection 19(1) of the regulations is amended by repealing clauses (a) and (b) and substituting the following clauses:
- (a) if the application is for a multiple unit residential complex or a condominium complex, in an amount equal to the tax paid on that portion of a supply of electricity
 - (i) recorded by a bulk meter and invoiced to the commercial electricity customer on or after September 1, 2008, and
 - (ii) that exceeds an amount equal to the total of
 - (A) an amount calculated by multiplying the number of days in any invoice period by 27.4 kilowatt hours per day by the number of residential units and residential condominium units connected to the bulk meter, and
 - (B) if the multiple unit residential complex or condominium complex contains any common area, an amount calculated by multiplying the number of days in the invoice period by 27.4 kilowatt hours per day; or
 - (b) if the application is for a mixed use property, in an amount equal to the tax paid, as determined under clause (a), in respect of the proportion of the mixed use property that comprises a residential complex or condominium complex calculated in accordance with the ratio $TRA \div TA$, in which
 - (i) TRA is the area comprising the residential complex or condominium complex within the mixed use property, and
 - (ii) TA is the total area of the mixed use property.
- 4 Subsection 20(3) of the regulations is repealed and the following subsection substituted:
- (3) A purchaser described in clause 19(2)(c) who purchases electricity, heating fuel or designated fuel for use in a mixed use property or a residential use property may submit a rebate application only in April, July, October or January of each year within the 24-month period specified in clause (1)(d).
