> Order in Council 2008-439 dated August 27, 2008 Amendment to regulations made by the Governor in Council pursuant to subsection 175(8) of the *Motor Vehicle Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal dated July 16, 2008, and pursuant to subsection 175(8) of Chapter 293 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Motor Vehicle Act*, is pleased to amend the *Seat Belt Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 221/2205, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2005-519 dated November 24, 2005, to exempt buses from the use of child restraint systems when there is no equipment available and to define "manufacturer-installed system", in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after August 27, 2008.

Amendment to the Seat Belt Regulations made by the Governor in Council pursuant to subsection 175(8) of Chapter 293 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the Motor Vehicle Act

- Section 1 of the *Seat Belt Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 221/2005, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2005-519 dated November 24, 2005, are [is] amended by adding "and Child Restraint System" immediately after "Seat Belt".
- 2 The regulations are further amended by repealing Section 2 and substituting the following Section:
 - 2 In these regulations,

"Act" means the *Motor Vehicle Act*;

"booster seat" means a child's car seat that is designed to seat an older child and is used, together with a seat belt, as a child restraint system for the child;

"Canada Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 207- Anchorage of Seats" means section 207 of Schedule IV to the *Motor Vehicle Safety Regulations*;

"Canada Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 208 - Occupant Restraint Systems in Frontal Impact" means section 208 of Schedule IV to the *Motor Vehicle Safety Regulations*;

"Canadian Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 209 - Seat belt Assemblies" means section 209 of Schedule IV to the *Motor Vehicle Safety Regulations*;

"Canadian Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 210 - Seat belt Assembly Anchorages" means section 210 of Schedule IV to the *Motor Vehicle Safety Regulations*;

"Canadian Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 210.1- User-friendly tether Anchorages for Restraint Systems" means section 210.1 of Schedule IV to the *Motor Vehicle Safety Regulations*;

"Canadian Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 210.2 - Lower Universal Anchorage Systems for Restraint Systems and Booster Cushions" means section 210.2 of Schedule IV to the *Motor Vehicle Safety Regulations*;

"Canada Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 213 - Child Restraint Systems" means Schedule 3, CMVSS 213 - Child Restraint Systems to the *Motor Vehicle Restraint Systems and Booster Cushions Safety Regulations*;

"Canada Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 213.1 - Infant Restraint Systems" means Schedule 4, CMVSS 213.1 - Infant Restraint Systems to the *Motor Vehicle Restraint Systems and Booster Cushions Safety Regulations*;

"Motor Vehicle Safety Regulations" means the Motor Vehicle Safety Regulations made under the Motor Vehicle Safety Act (Canada);

"Motor Vehicle Restraint Systems and Booster Cushions Safety Regulations" means the Motor Vehicle Restraint Systems and Booster Cushions Safety Regulations made under the Motor Vehicle Safety Act (Canada);

"out-of-Province vehicle" means a motor vehicle that is registered or required to be registered in a jurisdiction other than the Province and operated in the Province, but that is not required to be registered under the Act.

- Section 3 of the regulations is amended by adding "and Section 8A" immediately after "in subsection 4(2)".
- 4 Section 5 of the regulations is amended by
 - (a) adding "- Infant Restraint Systems" immediately after "Standard 213.1"; and
 - (b) adding "213.5 Restraint Systems for Infants with Special Needs" immediately after "Standard 213.5".
- 5 Clause 6(a) of the regulations is amended by
 - (a) adding "- Child Restraint Systems" immediately after "Standard 213" in subclause (i);
 - (a) adding "- Infant Restraint Systems" immediately after "Standard 213.1" in subclause (ii);
 - (a) adding "- Restraint Systems for Disabled Persons" immediately after "Standard 213.3" in subclause (iii);
 - (a) adding "- Built-in Child Restraint Systems and Built-in Booster Cushions" immediately after "Standard 213.4" in subclause (iv);
 - (a) adding "213.5 Restraint Systems for Infants with Special Needs" immediately after "Standard 213.5" in subclause (v).
- 6 Section 7 of the regulations is amended by adding "- Booster Cushions" immediately after "Standard 213.2".

The regulations are further amended by adding the following Section immediately after Section 8:

Child restraint systems on buses

- **8A** (1) In this Section, "manufacturer-installed system" means a system installed by a manufacturer in accordance with the following standards as required by Schedule III to the *Motor Vehicle Safety Regulations* made under the *Motor Vehicle Safety Act* (Canada):
 - (a) Canada Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 207- Anchorage of Seats;
 - (b) Canada Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 208 Occupant Restraint Systems in Frontal Impact;
 - (c) Canadian Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 209 Seat belt Assemblies;
 - (d) Canadian Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 210 Seat belt Assembly Anchorages;
 - (e) Canadian Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 210.1- User-friendly tether Anchorages for Restraint Systems;
 - (f) Canadian Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 210.2 Lower Universal Anchorage Systems for Restraint Systems and Booster Cushions.
 - (2) Sections 3 to 7 do not apply to a child who is less than 9 years old when in a bus, school bus or transit bus being operated on the highway if there is no seating position with a manufacturer-installed system that allows the use of a child restraint system available to the child.

Order in Council 2008-452 dated August 27, 2008 Amendment to Order in Council 2008-309 made by the Governor in Council pursuant to subsection 67(13) of the *Motor Vehicle Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure renewal dated August 14, 2008, and pursuant to subsection 67(13) of Chapter 293 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Motor Vehicle Act*, is pleased to amend Order in Council 2008-309 dated June 3, 2008, which established new *Alcohol Ignition Interlock Program Regulations*, to change the effective date for the regulations by striking out "September 1, 2008" and substituting "September 30, 2008".
