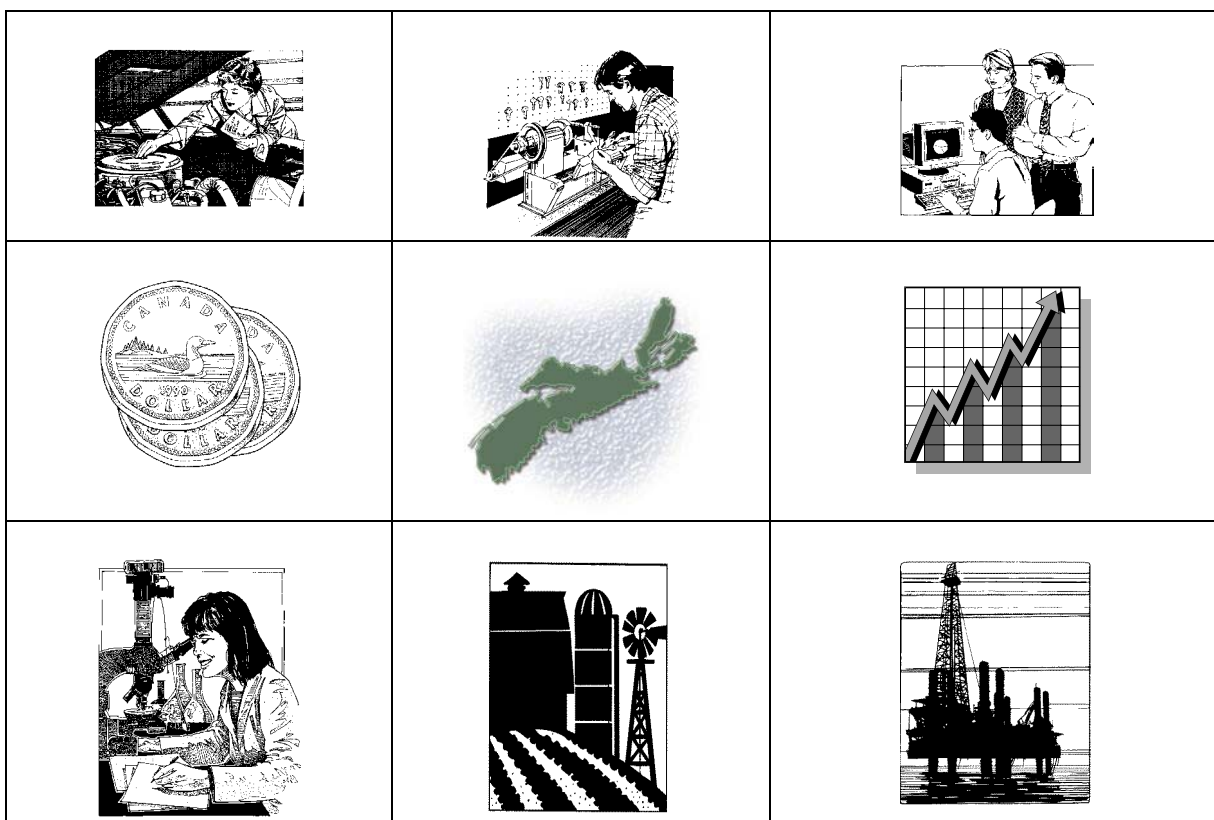


Nova Scotia Business Statistics 2002



Revised May 26, 2003

Introduction

Data on the number of businesses, employment and payroll is compiled at the national and provincial level by Statistics Canada's Small Business and Special Survey Division and published annually in *Employment Dynamics*¹. This edition of the Nova Scotia Business Statistics provides information from the most recent release of the *Employment Dynamics*, which is based on the latest available corporate tax database. The data cover all private and public sector businesses or organizations, including public administration, that issue T4 slips to employees for taxation purposes. Both incorporated and unincorporated entities are included, but only if they issue T4 slips to employees². Therefore, non-employer businesses³ are not included in the figures.

In order to provide more recent information, additional statistics are drawn from other sources. This release of the Nova Scotia Business Statistics also incorporates 2002 data on business by county and industry from Statistics Canada's Business Register. The major sources of information for the Business Register are updates from the Statistics Canada survey program and from Canada Customs and Revenue Agency's (CCRA) Business Number account files. The definition of business used in this source is wider and includes all *business establishments*, defined as the smallest operating entities capable of reporting all basic industrial statistics⁴ and having paid employees⁵. Those entities that do not maintain an employee payroll, but may have a workforce that consists of contracted workers, family members or business owners are not included in those figures, since the Business Register does not have this information available.

Information on self-employment, part-time and full-time employment is provided from Statistics Canada's Labour Force Survey. Number of business bankruptcies reported is sourced from Industry Canada's Superintendent of Bankruptcy Office, while registration of new companies is from Registry of Joint Stock Companies.

² The *Employment Dynamics* for a specific province counts every business issuing a T4 in that province. For example, a business with employees in both Nova Scotia and Ontario is counted as a business in each of the Nova Scotia and Ontario. Businesses operating in multiple provinces are not, however, counted multiple times at the Canada level.

³ Business activity such as a corner store that is owner-operated with no paid employees would be excluded from this employer-based file.

⁴ The establishment should not be confused with the legal entity or place of business. For example, one legal entity, especially for large organizations, could be related to more than one establishment. Alternatively, one business establishment could represent more than one place of business.

⁵ An employee is defined as any person drawing pay for services rendered and for paid absences, and for whom their employer is required to remit to Canada Customs and Revenue Agency deductions for Income Tax, Canada Pension Plan and Employment Insurance.

- There were 33,138 businesses with paid employees in Nova Scotia in 1999-2000. This represents a 4.5% increase in a number of businesses between 1991-1992 and 1999-2000, as compared to a 7.0% growth for Canada, over the same time period.
- The growth in a number of business entities was slower in Nova Scotia's small business sector than in the large business sector, at 4.2% and 8.7%, respectively during the 1991-1992 and 1999-2000 period.
- In 1999-2000, the small business sector accounted for 92.2% of all businesses in Nova Scotia, as compared to 97.4% in Canada, while the large business sector accounted for 7.9% of all businesses in Nova Scotia, as compared to 2.6% in Canada.
- The fastest growth in the number of businesses in Nova Scotia, between 1991-1992 and 1999-2000, was observed in business services (35.6%), educational services (31.4%) and manufacturing (26.4%). By contrast, a decline in the number of businesses was experienced in government services (-20.2%), agriculture and related services (-13.7%), retail trade (-8.8%) and construction (-6.8%), over the same time period.

- While total employment in all businesses in Nova Scotia increased by 8.1% during the period 1991-1992 to 1999-2000, employment at the national level increased by 12.6%. In Nova Scotia, employment growth was slightly higher in the small business sector, at 8.3%, compared to 8.0% in the large business sector. However, businesses with less than five employees experienced a slower growth at 5.2%.
- In 1999-2000, the large business sector employed 257,700 persons or 70.2% of all employees in Nova Scotia compared with 68.1% at the national level. The small business sector employed 109,600 individuals or 29.9% of all business employees in the province compared to 31.9% at the national level.
- The fastest growth in employment in Nova Scotia, between 1991-1992 and 1999-2000, was observed in business services (39.2%), health and social services (28.5%) and in real estate and insurance (25.0%). The significant decline in employment was experienced in mining, quarrying and oil wells (-26.8%), government services (-10.6%) and communication and other utilities (-4.1%).
- Approximately 74.6% of the \$10,970 million in payroll in 1999-2000 was derived from Nova Scotia's large business sector compared to 77.5% in 1991-1992. The remaining 25.4% of the payroll in 1999-2000 was derived from Nova Scotia's small business sector compared to 22.5% in 1991-1992.
- In 1999-2000, the overall payroll per employee was \$25,401 in businesses with less than 50 employees compared to \$31,766 in businesses with 50 or more employees.
- In 2001-2002, there were 9,507 new company registrations in the province, a 9.3% decline from 2000-2001 and 0.2% decline from 1997-1998. The number of new partnership and business name registrations declined from 57.7% of all new registrations in 1997-1998 to 51.3% in 2001-2002. Incorporations under the Companies Act and registration under the Corporations Registration Act increased from 31.0% to 36.6% and from 5.8% to 6.8%, respectively, over the same time period.

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- There were 314 business bankruptcies in Nova Scotia in 2002, down 22.1% from 2001. Three industries, retail, construction, and transportation and storage accounted for almost half of the bankruptcies in 2002, 19.1%, 12.4% and 12.1%, respectively. Liabilities associated with the year's bankruptcies rose 18.2% from the 2001 level to \$84.0 million in 2002.

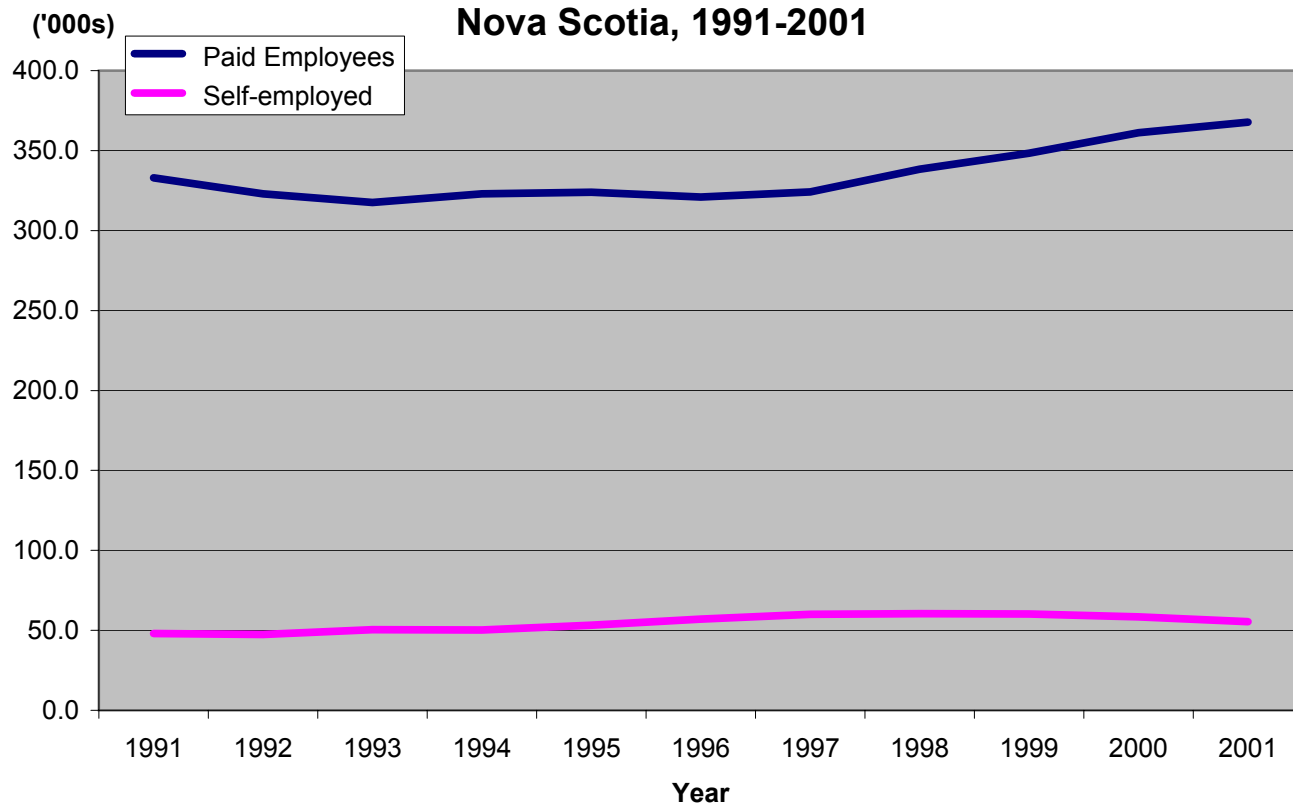

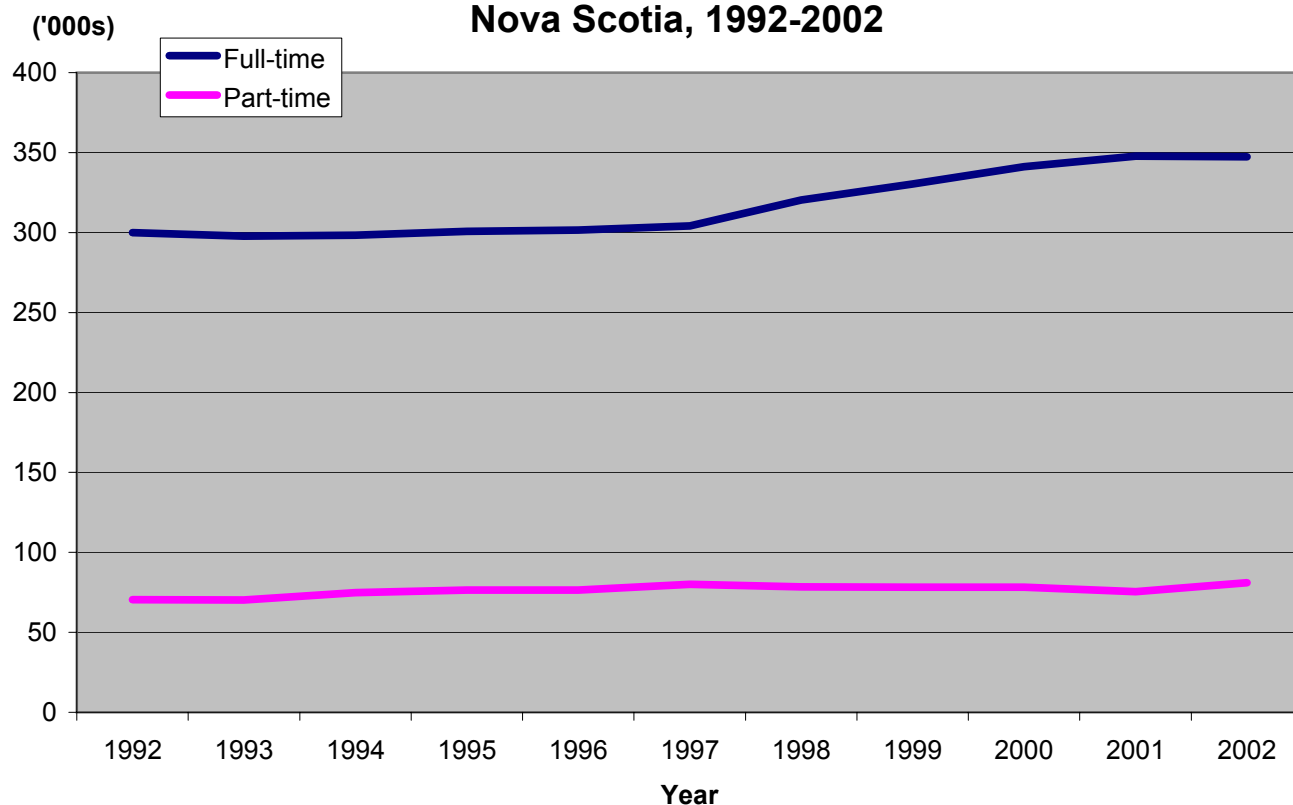
