PROTOCOL

This is a Protocol for Crown Attorneys and Correctional Services personnel in relation to s.525 of the **Criminal Code**.

- The Correctional Services Division will identify cases where persons are entitled, or are about to become entitled, to a hearing pursuant to s.525 of the Criminal Code.
- 2. (a) Upon the introduction of this protocol, in relation to persons who are already entitled to a s.525 hearing or persons who will, within 5 days, be entitled to a s.525 hearing, the Correctional Services Division will immediately contact the local Crown attorney and advise of such cases;
 - (b) In other cases, the Correctional Services Division will give the local Crown Attorney 5 days advance notice of cases where persons are about to become entitled to a s.525 hearing.
- 3. Upon receipt of notice pursuant to clause 2, the local Crown Attorney will advise the Correctional Services personnel of the date and time for the Application to set a Date for a s.525 hearing.
- 4. The Correctional Services Division will complete the necessary forms for the Application to set a Date for a s.525 hearing.
- Correctional Services personnel will serve copies of the forms on the person entitled to the s.525 hearing at least 2 clear days before the date set to make the Application to set a Date for the s.525 hearing.
- 6. Correctional Services will deliver the original documents and one copy to the local Crown Attorney's office at least 3 clear days before the date of the Application to set a Date for the s.525 hearing.
- 7. The Crown Attorney will obtain a Pick-up Order for the prisoner.

8. Correctional Services will transport the prisoner to the court at the appropriate time for the Application to set a Date for the s.525 hearing.

9. The local Crown Attorney will conduct all courtroom proceedings in relation to the s.525 hearing.
