Citation

1 These regulations may be cited as the *Gunshot Wounds Mandatory Reporting Regulations*.

Definition

2 In these regulations, "Act" means the *Gunshot Wounds Mandatory Reporting Act*.

Prescribed persons for making disclosure under Section 3 of Act

3 The persons responsible for disclosing the information required by Section 3 of the Act on behalf of a hospital, facility or service that has treated an individual for a gunshot wound are prescribed as the persons designated for that purpose by the hospital, facility or service.

Reg. 25/2001, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2001-138 dated March 23, 2001, to exempt up to \$3000 of wages earned in the production of Christmas wreaths from chargeable income of a recipient, in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after November 4, 2008.

- (a) seasonal harvesting of field-produced horticulture;
 - (b) harvesting Christmas trees;
 - (c) producing Christmas wreaths.

- (a) amend the *Provincial Housing Emergency Repair Program Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 214/2005, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2005-496 dated November 4, 2005, to revise the household income limits to be consistent with recent changes made by Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation, in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation; and
- (b) amend the *Senior Citizens Assistance Program Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 215/2005, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2005-496, dated November 4, 2005, to revise the household income limits to be consistent with recent changes made by Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation and to update the income limit for certain 1-bedroom households to reflect federal indexation of Canada Pension Plan, Old Age Security and Guaranteed Income Supplement payments, in the manner set forth in Schedule "B" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation.
