Whereas the purpose of the *Petroleum Products Pricing Regulations* is to ensure just and reasonable prices for specified petroleum products taking into consideration the objectives of preserving the availability of such products in rural areas, stabilizing prices of such products and minimizing the variances in prices of such products across the Province;

And whereas the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board (“Board”) considered the manner in which it would proceed to set petroleum prices in its decision, 2006 NSUARB 108, issued on October 16, 2006;

And whereas the Board revised the retail margin and transportation allowance effective January 6, 2012, in its decision, 2011 NSUARB 181, issued on November 23, 2011;

And whereas the Board revised the wholesale margin effective January 4, 2013, in its decision 2012 NSUARB 213, issued on December 12, 2012;

And whereas the average of the average of the daily high and low reported product prices (in Canadian cents) for the week ended June 18, 2014, are:

Grade 1 Regular gasoline	84.4¢ per litre
Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil	86.1¢ per litre

Now therefore the Board prescribes the benchmark prices for petroleum products to be:

Gasoline:	
Grade 1	84.4¢ per litre
Grade 2	87.4¢ per litre
Grade 3	90.4¢ per litre
Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil	86.1¢ per litre

And now therefore the Board has determined, based on historical data regarding price changes and to achieve revenue neutrality, it is appropriate to apply, and the Board so orders, forward averaging corrections of:

Gasoline:	plus 0.4¢ per litre
Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil:	plus 0.6¢ per litre

And now therefore the Board prescribes the prices for petroleum products as set forth in Schedule “A” effective on and after 12:01 a.m., June 20, 2014.

And whereas by resolution of the Executive of the Union dated May 26, 2014, the Executive approved the amendments to the Regulations (Section 5) as set out in Schedule "A" attached hereto and authorized the President of the Union to sign the amendments to the Regulations on behalf of the Executive;

1 Add new subsection 5(2) as follows:

- 5(2)** Despite subsection 5(1), effective August 1, 2014, every employed member shall contribute to the Fund the sum of
- (a) 9.3% of the portion of the member’s annual pensionable earnings that are equal to or less than the Y.M.P.E.; and
 - (b) 10.9% of the portion of the member’s annual pensionable earnings that are in excess of the Y.M.P.E.

2 Add new subsection 5(2A) as follows:

- 5(2A)** Despite subsections 5(1) and 5(2), effective August 1, 2015, every employed member shall contribute to the Fund the sum of
- (a) 10.3% of the portion of the member’s annual pensionable earnings that are equal to or less than the Y.M.P.E.; and
 - (b) 11.9% of the portion of the member’s annual pensionable earnings that are in excess of the Y.M.P.E.

3 Add new subsection 5(2B) as follows:

5(2B) Despite subsections 5(1), 5(2) and 5(2A), effective August 1, 2016, every employed member shall contribute to the Fund the sum of

- (a) 11.3% of the portion of the member's annual pensionable earnings that are equal to or less than the Y.M.P.E.; and
 - (b) 12.9% of the portion of the member's annual pensionable earnings that are in excess of the Y.M.P.E.

 the *Teachers' Pension Act***

1 Add subsection 5(2C) as follows:

5(2C) A member who commences receiving Union Long Term Disability Insurance benefits on or after August 1, 2014 shall contribute to the Fund and accumulate pensionable service on the same basis as an employed member who is in receipt of pensionable earnings from a participating employer.

2 Add subsection 5(2D) as follows:

5(2D) A member who is contributing to the Fund under subsection (2C) shall make contributions based on the pensionable earnings they would receive for the position they held immediately prior to being absent from duty on unpaid sick leave or commencing to receive Union Long Term Disability Insurance benefits.

3 Repeal clause 5(3)(a) and replace with:

5(3)(a) The Minister shall match the contributions made by members employed by school boards, the Union or the Canadian Teachers' Federation, including members who are contributing to the Fund under subsection (2C).

4 Repeal clause 5(3)(b) and replace with:

5(3)(b) Participating employers other than those in clause (a) shall match the contributions made by the members they employ, including members who are contributing to the Fund under subsection (2C).

5 Add subsection 17(2A) as follows:

17(2A) Despite subsections (1) and (2), no application for a disability pension shall be received by the Plan administrator after July 31, 2014 unless the applicant was absent from duty on unpaid sick leave as at June 30, 2014 and the application is made before August 1, 2016.

6 Add clause 31(1)(ai) as follows:

31(1)(ai) Despite clause (a), a member who commences receiving Union Long Term Disability Insurance benefits on or after August 1, 2014 may purchase a period of pensionable service equal to the period during which the member was absent from duty on unpaid sick leave without being subsequently re-employed for a period of not fewer than 50 days in a school year.
