The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister responsible for the *Retail Business Uniform Closing Day Act* dated October 5, 2006, and pursuant to subsection 3(2) and Section 8 of Chapter 402 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Retail Business Uniform Closing Day Act*, is pleased, effective on and after October 6, 2006, to

- (a) repeal the *Retail Business Uniform Closing Day Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 98/2006, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2006-315 dated June 28, 2006; and
- (b) make new regulations respecting retail business uniform closing days in the form set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation.

Regulations Respecting Retail Business Uniform Closing Days made by the Governor in Council under subsection 3(2) and Section 8 of Chapter 402 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the Retail Business Uniform Closing Day Act

#### Citation

1 These Regulations may be cited as the *Retail Business Uniform Closing Day Regulations*.

#### **Exemptions from Section 3 of the Act**

All goods and services sold, offered for sale or purchased by retail are prescribed as goods and services to which Section 3 of the *Retail Business Uniform Closing Day Act* does not apply.
