- (a) amend the *Summary Offence Tickets Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 281/2011, made by the Attorney General and Minister of Justice by Order dated October 4, 2011, in the manner set forth in the attached Schedule “A”, to reflect the increases in the charge provided for in subsection 8(6) of the Act, as amended by Chapter 6 of the Acts of 2015, the *Financial Measures (2015) Act*; and
- (b) order and direct that the penalty to be entered on a summons in respect of an offence set out in the regulations, as set forth in the attached Schedule “A”, is the out of court settlement amount listed or indicated by category letter in the out of court settlement column set out opposite the description for the offence, as increased by the amendments to the regulations set forth in Schedule “A”, and includes the charge provided for in, and in accordance, with Sections 8 and 9 of the Act.

This Order is effective on and after August 1, 2015.

Amendment to regulations made by the Minister of Health and Wellness and the Governor in Council pursuant to clause 13(1)(c) and subsection 17(2) of the *Health Services and Insurance Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Health and Wellness dated June 11, 2015, and pursuant to clause 13(1)(c) and subsection 17(2) of Chapter 197 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Health Services and Insurance Act* (the “Act”), is pleased, effective on and after July 14, 2015, to

- (a) pursuant to subsection 17(2) of the Act, amend the *Insured Dental Services Tariff Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 62/2013, made by the Minister of Health and Wellness and the Governor in Council by Order



in Council 2013-85 dated March 26, 2013, to amend fee codes and policies regarding oral exams and emergency exams in accordance with the tariff amounts established by the Minister of Health and Wellness pursuant to clause 13(1)(c) of the Act, in the manner set forth in Schedule “A” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation; and

- (b) in accordance with clause 13(1)(c) of the Act, approve the authorization by the Minister of Health and Wellness of payments in respect of the tariff amounts referred to in clause (a), and of lump-sum payments of 2% of the total paid claims to MSI dental programs for 2013-2014 and 1% of the total paid claims to MSI dental programs for 2014-2015. **In the matter of an amendment to the tariff of fees established by the Minister of Health and Wellness  
pursuant to clause 13(1)(c) of the *Health Services Insurance Act*

**Amendment to the *Insured Dental Services Tariff Regulations*  
made by the Governor in Council under subsection 17(2) of  
Chapter 197 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989,  
the *Health Services and Insurance Act***

- 1 Part 1: Diagnostic—01000–09999 of Schedule A: Cleft Palate/Craniofacial Program to the *Insured Dental Services Tariff Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 62/2013, made by the Minister of Health and Wellness and the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2013-85 dated March 26, 2013, is amended, under the centred heading “Examinations”, as follows:

- (a) in item 1, Examinations and diagnosis, complete oral,
  - (i) striking out “39.00” in the G.P. Fee column for fee code 01101 and substituting “34.40”,
  - (ii) striking out “50.37” in the Specialist Fee column for fee code 01101 and substituting “64.80”,
  - (iii) striking out “39.00” in the G.P. Fee column for fee code 01102 and substituting “44.80”,
  - (iv) striking out “50.37” in the Specialist Fee column for fee code 01102 and substituting “92.80”,
  - (v) striking out “65.45” in the G.P. Fee column for fee code 01103 and substituting “60.80”,
  - (vi) striking out “73.04” in the Specialist Fee column for fee code 01103 and substituting “126.40”;
- (b) in item 2, Examinations and diagnosis, limited oral, striking out the paragraph immediately under the listing for fee code 01205 and substituting the following paragraph:

The fee for a specific (01204) oral examination applies only when no treatment is rendered during the appointment. If a procedure or treatment service is also provided, only the fee for the procedure or treatment service is allowed (unless otherwise specified). If a procedure or treatment service is provided the same day as an emergency (01205) oral examination, the fee for the examination is paid at 50%.

2 Part 1: Diagnostic—01000–09999 of Schedule B: Children’s Oral Health Program to the regulations is amended, under the centred heading “Examinations”, as follows:

- (a) in item 1, Examinations and diagnosis, complete oral,
  - (i) striking out “39.00” in the G.P. Fee column for fee code 01101 and substituting “34.40”,
  - (ii) striking out “50.37” in the Specialist Fee column for fee code 01101 and substituting “64.80”,
  - (iii) striking out “39.00” in the G.P. Fee column for fee code 01102 and substituting “44.80”,
  - (iv) striking out “50.37” in the Specialist Fee column for fee code 01102 and substituting “92.80”,
  - (v) striking out “39.00” in the G.P. Fee column for fee code 01103 and substituting “60.80”,
  - (vi) striking out “50.37” in the Specialist Fee column for fee code 01103 and substituting “126.40”;
- (b) in item 2, Examinations and diagnosis, limited oral, adding the following paragraph immediately below the listing for fee code 01205:

If a procedure or treatment service is provided the same day as an emergency (01205) oral examination, the fee for the examination is paid at 50%.
