And whereas the Board revised the retail margin and transportation allowance effective January 6, 2012, in its decision, 2011 NSUARB 181, issued on November 23, 2011;

**And whereas** the Board revised the wholesale margin effective January 4, 2013, in its decision, 2012 NSUARB 213, issued on December 12, 2012;

**And whereas** the average of the average of the daily high and low reported product prices (in Canadian cents) for the week ended August 24, 2016, are:

Grade 1 Regular gasoline 51.3¢ per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil 50.7¢ per litre

**Now therefore** the Board prescribes the benchmark prices for petroleum products to be:

## **Decision and Order**

Whereas in a decision dated June 24, 2016, the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board ("Board") approved the number of electoral districts at 15, each electing one member, and reserving its jurisdiction to consider the electoral district boundaries;

**And whereas** the Chignecto-Central Regional School Board ("school board") retained Stantec Consulting Ltd. to prepare a report respecting proposed boundaries and the school board considered the report at its meeting of July 9, 2016, and approved the making of this application respecting the boundaries;

**And whereas** the school board filed its supplemental application on July 29, 2016, outlining its request for approval of the proposed boundaries;

**And whereas** the Board considered the application at a hearing held by telephone conference call on August 22, 2016;

**And whereas** no member of the public has appeared before the school board or this Board to oppose the application;

**And whereas** the Board finds that the application respecting the boundaries of the electoral districts should be approved;

## It is hereby ordered that:

- 1. The number of electoral districts for the Chignecto-Central Regional School Board is set at 15, each electing one member;
- 2. The proposed boundaries of the electoral districts are approved; and
- 3. The descriptions of all electoral districts are set out in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of this order;

And it is further ordered that all provisions of the *Education Act* and the *Municipal Elections Act* and any other Acts of the Province of Nova Scotia applying to the preparation for and holding of the regular election of school board members in the year 2016 will be complied with as if the above-noted changes had been made on the first day of March 2016, but for all other purposes such changes shall take effect on the first day of the first meeting of the school board after the election of school board members for the year 2016.

**Electoral District 10** is comprised of polling districts 1, 2, 3, 7 and 10 of the Municipality of the District of East Hants.

**Electoral District 11** is comprised of polling districts 5, 6, 7, 11 and 12 of the Municipality of the County of Pictou.

Electoral District 12 is comprised of polling districts 1, 2 and 3 of the Town of New Glasgow.

**Electoral District 13** is comprised of polling district 7 of the Municipality of the County of Colchester, polling districts 3 and 4 of the Municipality of the County of Pictou and the Town of Pictou.
