Whereas the purpose of the *Petroleum Products Pricing Regulations* is to ensure just and reasonable prices for specified petroleum products taking into consideration the objectives of preserving the availability of such products in rural areas, stabilizing prices of such products and minimizing the variances in prices of such products across the Province;

And whereas the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board (“Board”) considered the manner in which it would proceed to set petroleum product prices in its decision, 2006 NSUARB 108, issued on October 16, 2006;

And whereas the Board revised the wholesale margin effective January 4, 2013, in its decision, 2012 NSUARB 213, issued on December 12, 2012;

And whereas the Board revised the retail margin and the transportation allowance effective October 28, 2016, in its decision, 2016 NSUARB 168, issued on September 26, 2016;

And whereas the average of the average of the daily high and low reported product prices (in Canadian cents) for the week ended November 1, 2017, are:

Grade 1 Regular gasoline	61.9¢ per litre
Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil	63.4¢ per litre

Now therefore the Board prescribes the benchmark prices for petroleum products to be:

And now therefore the Board has determined, based on historical data regarding price changes and to achieve revenue neutrality, it is appropriate to apply, and the Board so orders, forward averaging corrections of:

Gasoline:	plus 1.1¢ per litre
Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil:	plus 1.2¢ per litre

And whereas a winter blending adjustment of plus 1.8¢ per litre is required for ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil;

And now therefore the Board prescribes the prices for petroleum products as set forth in Schedule “A” effective on and after 12:01 a.m., November 3, 2017.

And now therefore the Board prescribes the prices for petroleum products as set forth in Schedule “A” effective on and after 12:01 a.m., November 10, 2017.

Limited Liability Partnerships Regulations—amendment

Order in Council 2017-278 dated November 14, 2017
Amendment to regulations made by the Governor in Council
pursuant to Section 71 of the *Partnership Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Attorney General and Minister of Justice and the Minister of Finance and Treasury Board dated October 3, 2017, and pursuant to Section 71 of Chapter 334 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Partnership Act*, is pleased to amend the *Limited Liability Partnerships Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 221/2003, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2003-552 dated December 19, 2003, to provide that the profession of chartered professional accounting is permitted to be practised in a limited liability partnership, in the manner set forth in Schedule “A” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after November 14, 2017.

**Amendment to the *Limited Liability Partnerships Regulations*
made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 71
of Chapter 334 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Partnership Act***

1 The *Limited Liability Partnerships Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 221/2003, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2003-552 dated December 19, 2003, are amended by repealing Section 2 and substituting the following Section:

Chartered professional accountants are permitted to practise in limited liability partnerships

2 The profession of a chartered professional accountant, as governed by the Chartered Professional Accountants of Nova Scotia pursuant to the *Chartered Professional Accountants Act*, is permitted to be practised in a limited liability partnership.

2 The regulations are further amended by repealing Section 4.

Interjurisdictional Support Orders Regulations—amendment

Order in Council 2017-279 dated November 14, 2017
Amendment to regulations made by the Governor in Council
pursuant to Section 55 of the *Interjurisdictional Support Orders Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Attorney General and Minister of Justice dated October 6, 2017, and pursuant to Section 55 of Chapter 9 of the Acts of 2002, the *Interjurisdictional Support Orders Act*, is pleased to amend the *Interjurisdictional Support Orders Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 73/2003, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2003-133 dated March 28, 2003, to provide for forms for the purpose of support and support-variation applications under the Act and to make other housekeeping amendments, in the manner set forth in Schedule “A” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after February 12, 2018.

**Amendment to the *Interjurisdictional Support Orders Regulations*
made by the Governor in Council under Section 55
of Chapter 9 of the Acts of 2002, the *Interjurisdictional Support Orders Act***

- 1 Subsection 2(1) of the *Interjurisdictional Support Orders Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 73/2003, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2003-133 dated March 28, 2003, is amended by striking out the clause letter before each definition.
- 2 (1) Subsection 3(1) of the regulations is repealed and the following subsection substituted:
 - (1) In addition to the information required by subsection 6(2) of the Act, a claimant's support application must be in the form required by the designated authority and include
 - (a) all financial and other information specified in the support application form; and
 - (b) any other information or documents required by the reciprocating jurisdiction.
 - (2) Subsection 3(2) of the regulations is amended by adding "of the Act" immediately after "subsection 7(1)".
- 3 (1) Subsection 4(1) of the regulations is repealed and the following subsection substituted:
 - (1) In addition to the information required in the affidavit under subsection 29(3) of the Act, an applicant's support-variation application must be in the form required by the designated authority and include
 - (a) all financial and other information specified in the support-variation application form; and
 - (b) any other information or documents required by the reciprocating jurisdiction.
 - (2) Subsection 4(2) of the regulations is repealed.
 - (3) Subsection 4(3) of the regulations is amended by adding "of the Act" immediately after "subsection 30(1)".
- 4 Subclause 9(1)(b)(iii) of the regulations is amended by adding "pay" immediately after "overtime".
