And as if Facebook fame and representing the amazing energy of Nova Scotia farmers weren't prize enough, we'll make a poster out of the winning entries and send you a copy.

Facebook cover photos are fussy. The photo must be horizontal and the farmer should occupy only about one third of it, otherwise they'll get cropped out. Also, the farmer should be to the right in the photo, so they don't get hidden by the profile pic. For example, here is the original pig photo



showing the portion that was still visible after we put it on Facebook. Finally, the photo should be approximately 2500 pixels wide, so that it can be used in the poster.

In order for the Nova Scotia Department of Agriculture to use your photo, you confirm that (a) your photo is your own original work; (b) you own all the rights in the photo, including copyright; (c) you have the right to give the Nova Scotia Department of Agriculture permission to use your photo for the THINKFARM Facebook cover photo and in a poster with the caption 'Farming. Just dig it.' (d) the photo is not defamatory and does not infringe on any Canadian laws or violate the rights of any third party; (e)

you have the consent of anyone who is identifiable in your photo or the consent of their parent/guardian if they are minors; (f) you waive any moral rights that you may have in the photo; (g) you hold harmless and indemnify the Department, its Ministers, the Minister's officers, employees and agents against any claims, demand, action, suit or other proceedings against the Province arising out of the use of the photo and your participation in this contest; (h) you understand that the THINKFARM Facebook page is a public page and that your photo may be viewed or shared in accordance with the terms of Facebook's privacy policies (<https://www.facebook.com/about/privacy/your-info>).

If you do not want to grant the Nova Scotia Department of Agriculture the permission set out above, please do not submit your photo.
