Our Department's response to requests from the public to communicate in French

Our French-language Service Plan is reflective of the priorities expressed through consultation with the Acadian and francophone population. We have also surveyed our own staff in an attempt to better position ourselves to meet the demand for these services. We continue to consult with key stakeholders within the Acadian and francophone communities to identify ways of continually improving programs and services.

French-language Services offered by DCS

- Offices in Yarmouth, Digby and Inverness counties are presently offering a range of services in French.
- DCS continues to support Early Childhood Development strategies that promote French-language Services. Funding to CPRPS (resource centre for Acadian early childhood educators) National Child Care Conference and Child Care Expansion grants are a few examples.
- After funding a feasibility study for a "hub model" service delivery system, DCS continues to work closely with the Acadian community regarding implementation of such a model.
- All Canada-Nova Scotia Skills and Learning Framework projects are now posted on the website in both official languages.
- DCS supports staff, identified in priority roles, with French-language training opportunities.
- DCS is committed to expanding the amount of French-language material posted on the Department's website, as well as linking pertinent information related to French-language Services.

How the plan will contribute to the preservation or growth of the Acadian and francophone communities

The French-language Services Plan adds to the Client Service Initiative. It holds us accountable and demonstrates our commitment to enhancing services as well as ensuring these are maintained for generations to come.
