 Amendment to regulations made by the Governor in Council
 pursuant to Section 47 of the *Income Tax Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Finance dated July 13, 2011, and pursuant to Section 47 of Chapter 217 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Income Tax Act*, is pleased to amend the *Film Industry Tax Credit Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 15/96, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 96-38 dated January 23, 1996, to remove the definition of total production costs and change the residency requirements in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after December 1, 2010.

- (i) before December 1, 2010, an employee of an eligible corporation who was resident in the Province on the last day of the calendar year preceding the year in which the eligible salary was earned, and
 - (ii) on or after December 1, 2010, an employee of an eligible corporation who was resident in the Province for tax purposes during the production period;
- (2) Clause 3(1)(fb) of the regulations is repealed and the following clause substituted:
- (fb) “eligible individual” means
- (i) before December 1, 2010, an individual who was resident in the Province on the last day of the calendar year preceding the year in which the eligible salary was earned, and
 - (ii) on or after December 1, 2010, an individual who was resident in the Province for tax purposes during the production period.
- (3) Clause 3(1)(h) of the regulations is repealed.
- (4) Subsection 3(1) of the regulations is further amended by striking out the semicolon at the end of clause (ia) and substituting a period.
- (5) Clause 3(1)(j) of the regulations is repealed.
- 2 Clause 4(a) of the regulations is amended by striking out “total production costs” and substituting “eligible salaries”.

Reg. 75/2005, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2005-94 dated March 4, 2005, to clarify the authority of Executive Council and to amend the definition of certificate, in the manner set forth in Schedule “A” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after August 2, 2011.

**Amendment to the Ministerial Land Transactions Regulations
made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 6 of Chapter 23 of the Acts
of 1996, the Court and Administrative Reform Act**

- 1 Section 1 of the *Ministerial Land Transactions Regulations*, N.S. Reg. ~~765/2005~~ [75/2005], made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2005-94 dated March 4, 2005, is amended by adding "*Natural Resources*" immediately before "*Ministerial Land*".
- 2 Clause 2(b) of the regulations is amended by adding "or a certificate of release as defined in Section 11 of the *Land Titles Clarification Act*" immediately after "*Crown Lands Act*".
- 3 Subsection 14(1) of the regulations is amended by striking out "Governor in Council" and substituting "Executive Council".
