Farm Practices Board Regulations

Order in Council 2001-112 made March 2, 2001 made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 15 of the Farm Practices Act

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries dated February 1, 2001, and pursuant to Section 15 of Chapter 3 of the Acts of 2000, the *Farm Practices Act*, is pleased to make regulations respecting the Farm Practices Board in the form set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after March 1, 2001.

#### Schedule "A"

Regulations Respecting the Farm Practices Board made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 15 of Chapter 3 of the Acts of 2000, the Farm Practices Act

#### Citation

1 These regulations may be cited as the Farm Practices Board Regulations.

## Terms of appointment

- 2 (1) Members of the Board shall be appointed for a term not exceeding 3 years and may be reappointed.
  - (2) Despite subsection (1), of the members first appointed, 1 shall serve for a term of 1 year, 2 shall serve for a term of 2 years and 4 shall serve for a term of 3 years.
  - (3) The Minister shall appoint 1 member of the Board to be Vice-chair.
  - (4) The Chair and the Vice-chair shall be appointed for a term not exceeding 3 years and they may be reappointed.

### **Duties of the Chair**

3 The Chair of the Board is responsible for the general supervision, direction and conduct of activities of the Board, and in the Chair's absence or inability to act, the Vice-chair shall have all powers of the Chair.

#### Remuneration

- 4 (1) The remuneration to be paid to the members of the Board for performing their duties as members shall be \$100.00 per day.
  - (2) The remuneration to be paid to the Chair of the Board for performing duties as Chair shall be \$150.00 per day.

#### **Expenses**

5 Reasonable travelling and living expenses that are necessarily incurred by the members of the Board in carrying out their duties as members shall be paid to the members in accordance with the established guidelines approved for civil servants.

# **Powers of the Board**

**6** The Board may engage a person who has technical or special knowledge to provide assistance in any capacity in a matter before the Board.

Baker, Q.C., and duly filed in the Office of the Registrar of Regulations on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2001, (Reg. 6/2001) and published in the Royal Gazette, Part II, Volume 25, Number 3 on the 9<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2001, from page 282-283, the persons named in the Ministerial Order were ordered to comply with the conditions set forth in Schedule "A" attached to the Ministerial Order respecting an on-site system which is located at 10157 Highway #333, Glen Margaret, in the Regional Municipality of Halifax, Province of Nova Scotia;

NOVA SCOTIA UTILITY AND REVIEW BOARD IN THE MATTER OF THE MUNICIPAL BOUNDARIES AND REPRESENTATION ACT and

> IN THE MATTER OF AN APPLICATION BY CAPE BRETON REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY and THE MUNICIPALITY OF THE COUNTY OF VICTORIA

to determine the county boundary line between Victoria County and Cape Breton County and to determine the municipal boundary line between the Municipality of the County of Victoria and the Cape Breton Regional Municipality.

#### **ORDER**

WHEREAS the Board heard an application pursuant to S. 24 of the Municipal Boundaries and Representation Act R.S.N.S. 1989, c. 298 to determine the county boundary line between Victoria County and Cape Breton County and to determine the municipal boundary line between the Municipality of the County of Victoria and the Cape Breton Regional Municipality and issued a decision on September 16, 1999;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that effective the date of this Order, the boundary line between Victoria County and Cape Breton County and the municipal boundary line between the Municipality of the County of Victoria and the Cape Breton Regional Municipality shall be as shown on the Administrative Plan and described as follows:

PREMISING that the coordinates hereinafter mentioned refer to the Nova Scotia Coordinate Reference System, having the following characteristics: based on the Average Terrestrial System 1977 (ATS77) Datum; Modified Transverse Mercator 3 degree Projection, Zone 4. Central Meridian 61 degrees 30 minutes West. Where the County Boundary is described as a Topographic Feature such as "thread of the stream", the end points of the feature shall be the Coordinate Values as stated below and the feature shall be as it resides in the Nova Scotia Topographic Data Base files PS7XFQ\_P and PS7PLL\_P as of October 5, 1999 at the Nova Scotia Geomatics Centre in Amherst, Nova Scotia. The Coordinate Values shall prevail in identifying the geographic location of the County and Municipal Boundaries. All lines shall be straight lines unless otherwise noted. Point numbers are in reference to point numbers shown on the diagram on this Administrative Plan showing the location of the County Boundary and the Municipal Boundary between Cape Breton and Victoria Counties, and between the Cape Breton Regional Municipality and the Municipality of the County of Victoria.

BEGINNING at a point # 1, having Coordinates North 5,146,115.0 East 4,597,008.0, said point being the midpoint between Low Point and Cape Smokey on the inland baseline as referenced in the "Territorial Sea Geographical Coordinates Order C.R.C., c. 1550 made under the Oceans Act;

THENCE Southwesterly to a point # 2, having Coordinates North 5,136,395.0 East 4,590,005.0, said point being the midpoint between Ciboux Island and Point Aconi;

THENCE Southwesterly to a point # 3 having Coordinates North 5,132,137.0 East 4,588,904.0, said point being at or near where the Thread of the Aconi Brook intersects the Low Water Mark of the Atlantic Ocean, to the westward of Point Aconi, at the eastern extremity of the Island of Boularderie;

THENCE following the Thread of the Aconi Brook upstream to a point #4, having Coordinates North 5,126,108.0 East 4,586,226.0, said point being at or near a point on the stream located on Crown Certificate 666 which appears to be depicted on CB-84 as an intersection between the stream and an old road:

THENCE Northwesterly to a point # 5, having Coordinates North 5,126,936.4 East 4,585,037.9, said point being at or near the South West comer of the William Ball Grant;

THENCE Southwesterly to a point # 6, having Coordinates North 5,116,987.9 East 4,576,868.5, said point being at or near the South West corner of the Rev. James Fraser Grant;

THENCE Southeasterly in a direction that is computed to be the same as a Bearing of South twenty degrees East (as it was in 1852) to a point # 7, having Coordinates North 5,115,007.5 East 4,578,607.3, said point being at or near the shore at Low Water Mark of the St. Andrew's Channel on the south side of Boularderie Island near Boularderie West;

THENCE Southeasterly on the same above mentioned course to a point # 8, having Coordinates North 5,113,560.8 East 4,579,877.5, said point being at or near the midpoint of the St. Andrew's Channel between Boularderie West and MacLean Point;

THENCE Southwesterly up the middle of the St. Andrew's Channel to a point # 9, having Coordinates North 5,104,925.0 East 4,570,814.0, said point being at or near the midpoint of the St. Andrew's Channel between Point Clear and a Point near Beaver Cove;

THENCE Southwesterly up the middle of the St. Andrew's Channel to a point # 10, having Coordinates North 5,101,557.0 East 4,565,430.0, said point being at or near the midpoint of the St. Andrew's Channel between Kempt Head and a point northeast of Shunacadie Harbour;

THENCE Southwesterly to a point # 11, having Coordinates North 5,099,279.0 East 4,560,068.0, said point being at or near the midpoint in the Great Bras d'Or between Burnt Point and Longbeach Point;

THENCE Southwesterly to a point # 12, having Coordinates North 5,091,391.0 East 4,554,312.0, said point being at or near the midpoint of the North Entrance of the Barra Strait;

THENCE Southerly to a point # 13, having Coordinates North 5,089,675.0 East 4,553,710.0, said point being at or near the midpoint of the South Entrance of the Barra Strait;

THENCE Southwesterly into the Bras d'Or Lake to a point # 14, being the common intersection of the boundaries of the County of Cape Breton, the County of Inverness, the County of Richmond and the County of Victoria, said point having Coordinates North 5,084,265.0 East 4,545,454.0, said point being located northeast of Point Malagawatch at the mouth of the so called St. Denis's Channel.
