> Order in Council 2003-207 dated May 9, 2003 Amendment to regulations approved by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 13 of the *Health Services and Insurance Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Health dated April, 2003, and pursuant to Section 13 of Chapter 197 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Health Services and Insurance Act*, is pleased to approve of amendments made by the Minister of Health to the *Prosthetic Devices Tariffs Regulations* made by the Minister of Health and the Governor in Council by Order in Council 1999-146 dated April 7, 1999, in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after April 1, 2003.

# In the matter of the *Prosthetic Devices Tariffs Regulations* made pursuant to Section 13 and subsection 17(2) of the *Health Services Insurance Act*

#### - and -

#### In the matter of the tariff of fees established by the Minister of Health pursuant to clause 13(1)(c) of the *Health Services Insurance Act* with respect to prosthetic devices

**WHEREAS** a tariff of fees for ocular prostheses, effective from April 1, 2000, until March 31, 2003, is set forth in the *Prosthetic Devices Tariffs Regulations* made pursuant to Section 13 and subsection 17(2) of Chapter 197 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Health Services and Insurance Act*;

**AND WHEREAS** it is desirable that the services for ocular prostheses remain unchanged, but that the tariff be replaced, effective April 1, 2003, until March 31, 2006;

**THEREFORE** I, Jane Purves, Minister of Health for the Province of Nova Scotia, pursuant to clause 13(1)(c) of Chapter 197 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Health Services and Insurance Act*, hereby replace the tariff of fees for ocular prostheses established in the *Prosthetic Devices Tariffs Regulations*, as set out in the attached amendments to the regulations, and I authorize payments in respect of the tariff.

This Order is effective on and after April 1, 2003.

#### Amendments to the *Prosthetic Devices Tariffs Regulations* made by the Minister of Health pursuant to Section 13 of Chapter 197 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Health Services and Insurance Act*

- 1 Subsection 4(2) of the *Prosthetic Devices Tariffs Regulations* made by the Minister of Health and the Governor in Council by Order in Council 1999-146 dated April 7, 1999, is repealed and the following subsection substituted:
  - (2) The tariff of fees for ocular prostheses is in effect from April 1, 2003, to March 31, 2006.
- 2 The regulations are further amended by repealing Schedule "C" and substituting the following schedule:

> Order in Council 2003-211 dated May 9, 2003 Regulations made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 174 of the *Elections Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Justice dated April 10, 2003, and pursuant to Section 174 of Chapter 140 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Elections Act*, is pleased, effective May 9, 2003, to

- (a) revoke the tariff of fees and expenses approved by Order in Council 2001-40 dated January 24, 2001; and
- (b) approve a new tariff of fees and expenses in the form set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation.

#### Schedule "A"

#### Tariff of Fees and Expenses made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 174 of Chapter 140 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Elections Act*

#### Interpretation

**1** In this Tariff,

- (a) "during an election" has the same meaning as in the *Elections Act*;
- (b) "official list of electors" means the official list that is certified by the returning officer pursuant to Section 62 of the *Elections Act*, with the addition of the electors who were added to the list of electors at the advance and ordinary polls.

#### **Returning officers**

- 2 The fees [fee] for services provided by a returning officer between elections, at the request of the Chief Electoral Officer, is a stipend to be determined by the Chief Electoral Officer, and -a expenses for travel, meals and accommodations as authorized under Section 26.
- 3 The fee for services provided by a returning officer during an election, including the receipt of the candidates' expenses, is,

(a)	if a poll is held	\$3900.00
	plus \$0.15 per name on the official list of electors; or	

(b) if no poll is held, 50% of the amount payable under clause (a).

#### Assistant returning officers (satellite office)

- 4 (1) The fee for services provided by an assistant returning officer during an election is,
  - (a) if a poll is held ..... \$3900.00
  - (b) if no poll is held, 50% of the amount payable under clause (a).

#### **Election clerks**

5 The fees for services provided by an election clerk during an election is,

- (a) if a poll is held ..... \$2550.00 plus \$0.10 per name on the official list of electors; or
- (b) if no poll is held, 50% of the amount payable under clause (a).

#### Assistant election clerks (satellite office)

#### Expenses for travel, meals and accommodation

- 26 The fees for a returning officer, election clerk or revision assistant/presiding officer for write-in ballots who is authorized to be paid a travel allowance in connection with the conduct of an election are as follows:
  - (a) for distance actually traveled by private car, supported by an itemized statement, the car kilometrage rate paid to public servants of the Province;
  - (b) for travel by other means of transportation, the expenses necessarily and reasonably incurred, supported by vouchers;
  - (c) for expenses for meals and accommodation, in accordance with the rate paid to public servants of the Province.
