Designations made by the Minister of Environment and Labour pursuant to subsection 13(3) of the *Teachers' Collective Bargaining Act*

Whereas the Minister of Education and the Nova Scotia Teachers Union (the "Union") have entered into an agreement dated September 19, 2003 (the "Agreement"), pursuant to subsection 13(2) of the *Teachers' Collective Bargaining Act* (the "Act") where they have agreed that specific matters contained within subclause 2(h)(ii) of the Act are the subject of bargaining between the Minister of Education and the Union; and

Whereas the Minister of Education and the Union have represented in the Agreement that the specific matters designated by this Order fall within paragraph 2(h)(ii)(E) of the Act;

It is hereby ordered that the following matters are hereby designated as matters that are to be the subject of bargaining between the Minister of Education and the Union:

- (a) accommodation;
- (b) advanced reporting credit;
- (c) capital projects;
- (d) contracting out;
- (e) deductions;
- (f) educational events:
- (g) employment insurance premium reduction;
- (h) falsely accused employee assistance;
- (i) individual contracts;
- (j) liability insurance;
- (k) school calendar; and
- (l) harassment.

Order in Council 2004-450 dated November 18,, 2004 Amendments to regulations made by the Civil Service Commission and approved by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 45 of the *Civil Service Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of the Public Service Commission dated October 20, 2004, and pursuant to Section 45 of Chapter 70 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Civil Service Act*, is pleased to approve of amendments made by the Public Service Commission to the general Civil Service Regulations, N.S. Reg 20/81, made by the Civil Service Commission and approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 81-268 dated March 3, 1981, to specify vacation leave for government lawyers in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to a forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after November 18, 2004.

Schedule "A"

Amendments to the General Civil Service Regulations made pursuant to Section 45 of Chapter 70 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Civil Service Act*

The general civil service regulations, N.S. Reg 20/81, made by the Civil Service Commission and approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 81-268 dated March 3, 1981, are amended by the Public Service Commission under Section 45 of the *Civil Service Act* as follows:

Section 48 of the general civil service regulations, N.S. Reg. 20/81, approved by Order in Council 81-268 dated March 3, 1981, is amended by adding the following subsection immediately after subsection (8):

- (9) Crown Attorneys with the Public Prosecution Service and solicitors with the Department of Justice's Legal Services Division and civil service government lawyers in positions outside of the Public Prosecution Service and the Legal Services Division who have been identified by the Public Service Commission as entitled to receive the same rates of compensation as solicitors in the Legal Services Division are entitled to receive vacation leave with pay effective April 1, 2002,
 - (a) during the first 72 months of service, at the rate of 1 1/4 days for each month of service;
 - (b) after 72 months of service, at the rate of 1 2/3 days for each month of service;
 - (c) after 192 months of service, at the rate of 2 1/12 days for each month of service; and
 - (d) after 300 months of service, at the rate of 2 ½ days for each month of service.
