Reg 65/91, approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 91-421 dated April 9, 1991, to increase the minimum number of continuing education hours required of optometrists, in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after January 1, 2005.

Amendments to the By-laws Respecting Optometrists made by the Nova Scotia Association of Optometrists pursuant to subsection 6(1) of Chapter 328 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Optometry Act*

The regulations respecting optometrists, N.S. Reg. 65/91, made by the Nova Scotia Association of Optometrists and approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 91-421 dated April 9, 1991, are amended by repealing Sections 41 and 42 and substituting the following Sections:

- **41** (1) Effective January 1, 2005, except as provided in subsection (2), each member must complete at least 45 hours of approved continuing education in optometry every 3 years, in 3-year periods set by the Board.
 - (2) A member must complete the following hours of approved continuing education for the 3-year period during which they graduate from a school, college or examining body designated in accordance with subsection 21(1):
 - (a) 22.5 hours, if they graduate in the 1^{st} year of a 3-year period;
 - (b) 11.25 hours, if they graduate in the 2^{nd} year of a 3-year period;
 - (c) 0 hours, if they graduate in the 3^{rd} year of a 3-year period.
 - (3) If a member earns more than the approved continuing education hours required for a 3-year period, the member may carry over up to 9 of those excess hours to the following 3-year period, except a member to which subsection (2) applies may carry over up to
 - (a) 4.5 of those excess hours to the following 3-year period, if they graduated in the 1st year of a 3-year period;
 - (b) 2.25 of those excess hours to the following 3-year period, if they graduated in the 2nd year of a 3-year period; and
 - (c) 0 hours, if they graduated in the 3^{rd} year of a 3-year period.
- 42 Approved continuing education consists of lectures, courses, seminars, workshops, services, studies, and achievements that serve to promote and improve the proficiency of optometrists in all matters relating to the practice of their profession and are listed and published by the Board as continuing education approved for the purpose of meeting the requirements of Section 41.

> Order in Council 2004-519 dated December 21, 2004 Regulations made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 11 of the *Court Officials Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Justice dated December 1, 2004, and pursuant to Section 11 of Chapter 373 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Court Officials Act*, is pleased to make regulations respecting the certification of the transcripts of court proceedings in the form set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after December 21, 2004.

Schedule "A"

Regulations Respecting the Certification of Transcripts of Court and other Proceedings made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 11 of Chapter 373 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989 the *Court Officials Act*

Citation

1 These regulations may be cited as the *Certification of Transcripts Regulations*.

Definitions

- 2 In these regulations
 - (a) "Act" means the *Court Officials Act*;
 - (b) "court transcriber" means a person appointed under the Act to transcribe proceedings or a person who has been certified as a court transcriber;
 - (c) "proceeding" has the same meaning as in the Civil Procedure Rules; and
 - (d) "transcript" means a typewritten transcription of a proceeding and includes any part of a transcription.

Recording of court proceedings

- 3 (1) A court transcriber or another person authorized by a court administrator may record a proceeding using any device for recording sound that is of a type approved by the Minister of Justice.
 - (2) A court transcriber may record a proceeding in any form of shorthand.

Certification of the record of court proceedings

- 4 (1) A transcript from shorthand or a sound recording made under Section 3 must be certified by a court transcriber to be a true and accurate transcription of the contents of the recording
 - (a) in Form 1, when signed by a court transcriber, or
 - (b) in Form 2, when signed by 2 or more court transcribers.

- A court transcriber who prepares and certifies a transcript under subsection (1) (2)
 - is not required to be the person who recorded the proceeding, if the proceeding is recorded by (a) an approved type of sound recording device in accordance with subsection 3(1);
 - must be the person who recorded the proceeding if the proceeding is recorded by shorthand in (b) accordance with subsection 3(2).

Official Record

- 5 (1) For the purposes of Section 9 of the Act, a transcript is a record of a proceeding which, when certified in accordance with these regulations, becomes the official record of the proceeding.
 - An official record of a proceeding is admissible as evidence and is proof, in the absence of evidence (2) to the contrary, that the record is a true and accurate transcription of the recording of the proceeding.
