And whereas the average of the average of the daily high and low reported product prices (in Canadian cents) for the week ended March 17, 2010, are:

Grade 1 Regular gasoline 58.2¢ per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil 57.8¢ per litre

Now therefore the Board prescribes the benchmark prices for petroleum products to be:

Grade 1 58.2ϕ per litre Grade 2 61.2ϕ per litre Grade 3 64.2ϕ per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil 57.8ϕ per litre

And now therefore the Board has determined, based on historical data regarding price changes and to achieve revenue neutrality, it is appropriate to apply, and the Board so orders, forward averaging corrections of:

Gasoline: plus 0.5¢ per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil: plus 0.4¢ per litre

And whereas a winter blending adjustment of plus 1.0¢ per litre is required for ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil;

And now therefore the Board prescribes the prices for petroleum products as set forth in Schedule "A" effective on and after 12:01 a.m., March 19, 2010.
