Whereas the purpose of the *Petroleum Products Pricing Regulations* is to ensure just and reasonable prices for specified petroleum products taking into consideration the objectives of preserving the availability of such products in rural areas, stabilizing prices of such products and minimizing the variances in prices of such products across the Province;

And whereas the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board ("Board") considered the manner in which it would proceed to set petroleum product prices in its decision, 2006 NSUARB 108, issued on October 16, 2006;

And whereas the Board revised the wholesale margin effective January 4, 2013, in its decision, 2012 NSUARB 213, issued on December 12, 2012;

And whereas the Board revised the retail margin and transportation allowance effective October 28, 2016, in its decision, 2016 NSUARB 168, issued on September 26, 2016;

And whereas the average of the average of the daily high and low reported product prices (in Canadian cents) for the week ended January 25, 2017, are:

Now therefore the Board prescribes the benchmark prices for petroleum products to be:

- Section 4 of the *Milk Classes and Categories Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 3/2006, made by the Natural Products Marketing Council on February 1, 2006, is amended by striking out "4" and substituting it with "4(1)".
- 2 The table in subsection 4(1) is amended by:
 - (a) striking out the row beginning "Class 3(b)" and substituting the following row:

Class 3(b)	Milk and any of its components that are processed to produce any of the following products: (a) cheddar cheese; (b) stirred cheese curd; (c) cream cheese; (d) creamy cheese bases or cheese mixes; (e) cheddar and cheddar-type cheese sold fresh; (f) any product not referred to in Class 3(a), elsewhere in 3(b), 3(c) or 3(d) made by coagulating milk, coagulating milk products or coagulating both milk and milk products with the aid of bacteria to form a curd excluding rennet casein curd used in the manufacture of non-standardized final products in the processed cheese category.

 - "National Ingredients Strategy Implementation Policy" means a policy established by the Board under Section 1B;

Board policy related to Ingredients Strategy

- 1B The Board may establish a policy with respect to the pricing of and payment for milk and milk components in accordance with the National Ingredients Strategy adopted by the Canadian Milk Supply Management Committee and the P5 Supervisory Body.
- 3 Subsection 3(1) is repealed and the following subsection substituted:
 - 3 (1) Except where otherwise specified in the National Ingredients Strategy Implementation Policy, milk processors in the Province must pay, on an F.O.B. plant basis, the prices of milk components set out in the following table for each class of milk specified:

 - (2) The creation of a written record of a prescription as set out in the *Food and Drug Regulations* (Canada) must be carried out before the prescription is dispensed.
 - (c) striking out "or electronic" in subsection (4);
 - (d) striking out "or a paper record attached to the prescription" in subsection (7);
 - (e) striking out "paper" in subsection (9);
 - (f) renumbering subsections (4) to (11).
- 3 Clause 20(1)(b) of the regulations is repealed and the following clause substituted:
 - (b) have been practising direct patient care pharmacy in Canada for a total of 12 months in the past five years;

Amendment to the Regulations Prescribing Drug Schedules made by the Council of the Nova Scotia College of Pharmacy [Pharmacists] under Section 81 of Chapter 11 of the Acts of 2011, the Pharmacy Act

The regulations prescribing drug schedules, N.S. Reg. 164/2003, made by the Council of the Nova Scotia College of Pharmacy [Pharmacists], is amended by adding the following Section immediately after the introductory paragraph:

Short title

- 1 These regulations may be cited as the *Drug Schedules Regulations*.
- 2 Schedule 1 of the regulations is amended by repealing Section 2 and substituting the following Section:
 - 2 The drugs and medicines in this Schedule require a prescription as a condition of sale.
