Schedule "A"

Amendment to the *Traffic Signs Regulations*made by the Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal
under Section 88 of Chapter 293 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989,
the *Motor Vehicle Act*

- Section 4 of the *Traffic Signs Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 165/2012, made by Order of the Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal dated August 22, 2012, is amended by adding the following subsection:
 - (3) RA-4L (FYG) and RA-4R (FYG) signs described in Section 8 may only be erected by a Traffic Authority for evaluation purposes and must be removed within one year of the effective date of this regulation.
- The table entitled "Designations and Description of Official Traffic Signs" in Section 8 of the regulations is amended by adding the following row immediately after the row containing the individual sign designation for RA-4 (R or L):

RA-4L (FYG), RA-4R (FYG)

"Pedestrian crosswalk" sign (FYG)

- must have a black symbol of a pedestrian on a florescent [fluorescent] yellow-green background
- must be oriented so that the symbol shows the pedestrian walking toward the centre of the roadway
- must be used only for evaluation purposes in accordance with Section [subsection] 4(3) of these regulations




