Locally significant park near Guysborough with access to Guysborough Shore. Borders stocked freshwater lake. Henry Sinclair monument in park. Yearly festival. access to small coastal island with walking trail, Guysborough Come Home Week Festival

Camping, walking trail, cross-country skiing, fishing, geocaching

Prince Henry Sinclair Monument (LOA)
